THE ROLE OF THE SECRETARY

Objective of the position

The role of Secretary is to ensure accurate record keeping and good administration of Church Council affairs to support and facilitate the Mission and Ministry of the Congregation.

Primary responsibilities

Ensuring meetings are effectively organised and accurately minuted Maintaining effective records and administration

Duties of the position include but are not limited to:

Ensures that all relevant records and documentation are correctly filed, recorded and kept up to date. Also that privacy and confidentiality are maintained.

Keeps an accurate record of all proceedings of the Congregation meetings. Ensures records of the congregation are held in a safe and secure location. Responsible for periodically transferring old records to LCA Archives for safekeeping.

Attends to all incoming and outgoing correspondence.

Prepares an agenda for meetings with the Chairperson.

Maintains a Congregation calendar which records key dates such as Annual General Meetings, contract expiry dates, property inspections, training events and registration renewals (eg blue cards, safe place training) Sends copy of the AGM book of reports to the District Office.

Passover Brunch

On Sunday 13th April about 20 members gathered after the service for a Passover Brunch. There was a short presentation by Pastor Kees which included an explanation of the various elements on the Sedar Plate.







Sedar Plate - Sedar meaning 'order'

The lamb bone reminds us of the sacrifices made in the temple. It also reminds us of Jesus, who is the Lamb of God.

The bitter herbs remind us of the sufferings of the people of Israel when they were slaves to Egypt. They are dipped in salt water before being eaten. .

Salt water reminds us of the tears that were shed by the Israelites in captivity.

vegetables that are traditionally eaten with the Passover Lamb.

The boiled egg represents a Passover offering that was brought to the temple
The charoset a sweet made of nuts, apple, spices and wine. It reminds people of
Israel of the precious stone and carvings which decorated the temple. It is also a
reminder of the clay that the Israelites used to make bricks for their Egyptian
masters. The charoset is eaten together with the bitter herbs, reminding us that we
share in the joy of Christ's resurrection, as well as in his sufferings on the cross.
The greens remind us that the Passover coincided with the arrival of Spring and that
Jesus came to make all things new. It also represents the green herbs and

The bread called Matzohs was a bread made without yeast. When the people of Israel left Egypt, they did not have time to wait for the dough to rise, so they made their bread without yeast.

LCA Child Safety Standards

Our leadership requires that all employees and volunteers who work with children, as well as our pastor(s) and other leaders are suitable, screened, supported, and monitored.

STANDARD 6:

Our reporting and complaints system is child focused.

Our congregation has a reporting and complaints process which has a clear focus on child safety, is accessible to children and is clear regarding roles and responsibilities.
