

The LCA Child Safety Standards (CSS) for Congregations are designed to help congregations maximise the safety of children and young people.

It is also envisaged that they will help the church to meet its regulatory responsibilities. All congregations with children participating in regular worship, prayer or children's ministry are expected to implement the Child Safety Standards.
